## General Rules for All Exhibitors

1. Every exhibitor at the Warren Fair MUST hold a current membership for the Warren Agricultural Society. Annual membership fee is \$5.00 for adults 18 years and older.
2. Next year's membership fee of \$5.00 will be retained from prize money earned in adult classes.
3. A \$5.00 entry fee will be charged for adult exhibitors. There is no entry fee for youth exhibitors.
4. Exhibitor numbers are assigned at time of membership purchase.
5. Ensure all exhibit information is entered correctly on the registration form **and** entry tag.
6. Registration forms and entry tags can be picked up from the fair secretary and/or the event chairperson.
7. Only one entry per exhibitor per section is allowed.
8. The judges' decisions are final.
9. Any grievances should be directed to the President of the Warren Agricultural Society, in writing before 3 pm on Sunday.

- ✓ See *General Rules for All Exhibitors* for details.
- ✓ Entries can be delivered to the Exhibit Hall on Thursday – between 7 pm and 9 pm and on Friday between 9 am and 11 am
- ✓ NO late entries will be accepted for judging but may be displayed for the duration of the fair.
- ✓ Be sure entry tags are firmly attached to each item. Do not use stick pins. String, elastics or safety pins work best
- ✓ Include the recipe and a list of ingredients on all food entries

## CLASS A – CANNING

### SECTION

1. Bread & Butter Pickles
2. Dill Pickles
3. Pickled Beets
4. Any relish
5. Salsa
6. Any Jam
7. Any Jelly
8. Any canned fruit
9. Any other canned item - not listed

Each item must be in a clean jar with old labels removed  
250 ml or 125 ml jars only will be judged unless otherwise specified

- Entries with broken seals will be disqualified

## Class B – BAKING

### SECTION

1. 3 chocolate chip cookies
2. 3 any other cookies
3. 3 bran muffins
4. 3 any variety muffin
5. Loaf of white bread
6. Loaf of whole wheat bread
7. Banana loaf
8. Zucchini loaf
9. 3 chocolate brownies
10. 3 date squares
11. 1 piece single crust pie
12. 1 piece double crust pie
13. 3 butter tarts
14. Homemade fudge – 4 pieces
15. 3 scones – any flavour
16. 3 cupcakes – decorated with Thanksgiving or Fall theme

Recipe and list of ingredients must be included

No food entry can contain nuts as an ingredients

All items must be homemade by the exhibitor – no mixes allowed

Each entry must be displayed on a disposable plate and in a freezer/storage bag

Entry tag must be securely attached to the bag, by the exhibitor

## CLASS C – BAKING SPECIALS

- Attach ingredient list
- Each entry must be displayed on a disposable plate in a freezer/storage bag with tags firmly attached

### SECTION

1. **OAAS Butter Tart with Raisin Competition** – Pastry and butter tart filling to be made by the exhibitor. Three, full size tarts (no mini or bite size tarts) to be exhibited on a disposable plate in a plastic bag.. No nuts or fruit other than the raisins. Standard prize money applies. Winning entry will be eligible to compete at the District Level. District winners are eligible to enter the Provincial Competition.

## **CLASS D – AGRICULTURE**

- Eggs should be presented in a proper egg carton and will be judged according to OAAS standard.

Prize Money - 1<sup>st</sup> - \$5.00

2<sup>nd</sup> - \$4.00

3<sup>rd</sup> - \$3.00

### **SECTION**

1. One dozen white eggs
2. One dozen brown eggs
3. One dozen 'coloured' eggs – not listed
  
4. Maple Syrup
5. Liquid Honey

## **CLASS E – HORTICULTURE**

### **SECTION**

1. Potted African Violet
2. Potted Geranium
3. Container of mums – potted or cut
4. Single stem of gladiolus
5. Arrangement of live/dried flowers in an unusual container. Total height of exhibit must be less than 100 cm
6. Arrangement of live/dried flowers in a fall vegetable
7. Any home grown flower or plant not mentioned
8. Succulent arrangement
9. Arrangement of roadside weeds in a container of choice

## **CLASS F – QUILTING**

- ✓ Samples of fabric and thread must be attached
- ✓ Entry tags should include Quilt Pattern Name

### **SECTION**

1. Quilt – hand quilted
2. Quilt – machine quilted
3. Any other quilted item not mentioned

## CLASS G – QUILTING SPECIALS

Prize money for this section –

1<sup>st</sup> - \$15.00

2<sup>nd</sup> - \$10.00

3<sup>rd</sup> - \$5.00

### SECTION

1. **Wrapped in Love** – an aged pieced quilt not necessarily made by the exhibitor. No samples to be attached. Quilt can show signs of age and use. Judge's choice.
2. **Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies (OAAS) Hand Quilted Championship Quilt Competition**  
Entry must be solely made and hand quilted by the exhibitor.  
Entries must me a **minimum of 324 inches** measured around the perimeter. The name of the quilt pattern must accompany entry.
3. **OAAS Machine Quilted Championship Quilt Competition**  
Entry must be solely made and machine quilted by the exhibitor. Exhibit to have a **minimum perimeter measurement of 324 inches** and may be any shape.

Winning quilt in section 2 & 3 is eligible to compete at the District Level.

## **CLASS J - KNITTING**

- ✓ Samples of yarn must be attached

### **SECTION**

4. Shawl/Wrap
5. Slippers
6. Pull over or Cardigan sweater
7. Socks
8. Baby set
9. Mittens
10. Dishcloth
11. Any other item not mentioned

## **CLASS K – HERITAGE CRAFTS**

### **SECTION**

1. Skein of handspun yarn – specify fibres and style (2 ply, nubby etc)
2. Article knitted, crocheted or woven from handspun yarn
3. Article woven on a loom – 12" x 24" to 24" x 48"
4. Any home crafted soap
5. Hand felted item
6. Pair of hand made candles

## CLASS L – NEEDLECRAFT

- ✓ Samples of yarn/fabric must be attached

### SECTION

1. Counted cross stitch – any item
2. Embroidered item
3. Hooked item
4. Any other item not mentioned

## CLASS M – ARTS & CRAFTS

### SECTION

1. Fall door decoration
2. Handmade jewelry
3. Decorated wreath – any occasion
4. Handcrafted greeting card with envelope
5. Barn quilt block – any medium, any surface – minimum size 12” x 12”
6. Item of stained glass
7. Any item decorated with folk art
8. Any item of woodworking
9. U.F.I. - any item that you just didn't get finished for the fair
10. Sketch in ink, pencil or chalk depicting ***Living in the North***
11. Water colour painting
12. Acrylic painting

## **CLASS O – Antiques & Collectibles**

- ✓ Cracks and flaws and/or soiled items are allowed
- ✓ Item must be at least 50 years old to qualify as antique, 25 years old to be considered collectible.

### **SECTION**

1. Single photograph of a family member – named – mounted or framed
2. Household utensil
3. Tool – please name
4. Toy
5. Bottle – any type
6. Children's book
7. Adult Book – farming related
8. School Day memorabilia
9. 'Fairvorite' picture of past Warren Fairs

## **CLASS P – PHOTOGRAPHY**

- ✓ Photos can be 4x6, 5x7, but no larger than 8x10
- ✓ Class is open to black & white and colour photography
- ✓ No framed photos allowed
- ✓ Photos must be mounted on mat board or Bristol Board with a one inch border unless otherwise specified
- ✓ No professional photography please

## **CLASS Q - Fruits, Roots & Vegetables**

### Section

1. Apples – same variety – set of 3 on a plate (stems to be attached)
2. 3 ripe tomatoes on a plate – calyx attached
3. 3 cucumbers on a plate
4. 2 corn cobs – 1/3 of husk and silk to be removed from tip to butt
5. 3 carrots on a plate – tops to be trimmed to 1 inch
6. 3 potatoes on a plate – brushed clean, not washed
7. Largest zucchini
8. Largest pumpkin
9. 5 green or yellow beans on a plate
10. 3 beets – tops trimmed to 1”

## **CLASS R - Poultry**

Entry fee: \$0.25 per entry

To complete the entry form, list the class, breed, variety – cock, hen, cockerel, pullet etc.

Ribbons only to be awarded.

### Section

1. Large Chickens – i.e.- American, Asiatic, English and other standard breeds
2. Bantam Chickens – i.e.- Modern Game, Game Single Comb, Clean Legged, Rose Comb etc.
3. Ducks – heavy, medium, light
4. Geese – heavy, medium, light
5. Turkeys
6. Guinea Fowl
7. Laying Hen display – at least 2 hens of the same breed
8. Meat pen – at least 2 or more of same breed

## **CLASS S – Rabbits**

Entry fee: \$0.25 per entry

Ribbons only to be awarded.

### Section

1. Fancy – Holland Lop, Netherland Dwarf, Mini Rex etc.
2. Utility – California, Giant chinchilla, Flemish Giant etc.

## **CLASS T – Sheep (Dairy, Meat or Commercial)**

Entry fee - \$2.00 per entry

All animals should be on grounds by 9 am

Show begins at 9:30 am

All animals must be properly tethered or penned. (limited pens are available – first come only)

Exhibitors are responsible for any damage, injuries or liabilities caused by their livestock.

All sheep must have C.S.I.P identification tags in their ears upon arrival.

Must be shown in halter/harness if the exhibitor is under 12 years of age.

All meat breeds should be shorn 2 weeks prior to show

All livestock must be clean, healthy and well-groomed or be subject to disqualification.

Clean, neat attire is recommended for all exhibitors.

Entry fee - \$2.00 per entry

All animals should be on grounds by 9 am

Show begins at 11:30 am

All animals must be properly tethered or penned. (limited pens are available – first come only)

Exhibitors are responsible for any damage, injuries or liabilities caused by their livestock.

All goats to be shown with collar unless otherwise specified.

All livestock must be clean, healthy and well-groomed or be subject to disqualification.

Clean, neat attire is recommended for all exhibitors.

This class is to promote wool/mohair and present the livestock in an attractive manner.

Exhibitor must wear at least one article of wool/mohair clothing.

The animal must be washed/clean and properly groomed.

All livestock are to be on a halter/collar/harness and lead at all times.

Contestants will be judged on their presentation and handling of their animal as well as on their appearance and how well they promote the fibre of their animal.

**2<sup>nd</sup> - \$20**

**3<sup>rd</sup> - \$15**

## **CLASS W – Cattle**

Entry fee - \$2.00 per entry

All animals should be on grounds by 9 am

Show begins at 10 am

All animals must be properly tethered or penned.

Exhibitors are responsible for any damage, injuries or liabilities caused by their livestock.

All livestock must be clean, healthy and well-groomed or be subject to disqualification.

Clean, neat attire is recommended for all exhibitors.

## SECTION

### Youth Poster – Original Handmade Design Promoting Our Fair

- Poster must be hand drawn – no computer graphics
- Poster must be a minimum of 22 X28 cm and no larger than 28X44 cm without borders
- Poster must be mounted & centered on black art card or black poster board showing a 5 cm border on all sides
- The Dates – September 9 & 10, 2022
- **Warren Fair** must be displayed in the design.

1. Junior – up to and including Grade 4
2. Intermediate – grades 5 to 8
3. Senior – grades 9 to 12

### 4. Plain Chocolate Chip Cookie Competition –

- open to all up to age 15 years as of December 31 of current year
- entry to include 8 chocolate chip cookies displayed on firm disposable plate
- each cookie must be no smaller than 5 cm and no larger than 6.75 cm in diameter

Winning entry from each of Section 1 – 4 is eligible to compete at the District level.
