General Rules for All Exhibitors

- 1. Every exhibitor at the Warren Fair MUST hold a current membership for the Warren Agricultural Society. Annual membership fee is \$5.00 for adults 18 years and older. Youth under 18 years do not pay a membership.
- 2. Next year's membership fee of \$5.00 will be retained from prize money earned in Open classes.
- 3. A \$5.00 entry fee will be charged for exhibitors in the OPEN classes. There is no entry fee for youth entries.
- 4. Exhibitor numbers are assigned at time of membership purchase.
- 5. Ensure all exhibit information is entered correctly on the registration form **and** entry tag.
- 6. Registration forms and entry tags can be picked up from the fair secretary and/or the event chairperson.
- 7. Only one entry per exhibitor per section is allowed.
- 8. The judges' decisions are final.
- 9. Any grievances should be directed to the President of the Warren Agricultural Society, in writing before 3 pm on show day.

All items must be homemade by the exhibitor – no mixes allowed
Each entry must be displayed on a disposable plate and in a freezer/storage bag
Entry tag must be securely attached to the bag, by the exhibitor

CLASS C - BAKING SPECIALS

- Attach ingredient list
- Each entry must be displayed on a disposable plate in a freezer/storage bag with tags firmly attached

SECTION

1. OAAS Butter Tart Competition – Pastry and butter tart filling to be made by the exhibitor. A total of 6 tarts will be required to be shown. Tarts must be on a clean, sturdy plate (no paper plates) inside of a clear plastic bag with the exhibitor's name, mailing address and fair represented. The size of the tarts must be full size tarts (no mini or bite size tarts) with no nuts or fruit. Standard prize money applies. Winning entry will be eligible to compete at the District Level. District winners are eligible to enter the Provincial Competition.

CLASS D – AGRICULTURE

 Eggs should be presented in a proper egg carton and will be judged according to OAAS standard.

CLASS E - HORTICULTURE

SECTION

- 1. Wrapped in Love an aged pieced quilt not necessarily made by the exhibitor. No samples to be attached. Quilt can show signs of age and use. Judge's choice.
- 2. Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies (OAAS) Hand Quilted Championship Quilt Competition

Entry must be solely made and hand quilted by the exhibitor. Entries must me a **minimum of 324 inches** measured around the perimeter. The quilt can be any shape (square, rectangle etc.) The name of the quilt pattern must accompany entry. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to give credit to the original designer of the quilt pattern based on copyright rules. Quilting must be through all 3 layers (top, batting and back) and not be mounted on a frame, the quilt may have a sleeve attached to the back for the purpose of hanging the quilt.

3. OAAS Machine Quilted Championship Quilt Competition Entry must be solely made and machine quilted by the exhibitor. Exhibit to have a minimum perimeter measurement of 324 inches and may be any shape (square, rectangle etc.). It is the exhibitor's responsibility to give credit to the original designer of the quilt pattern based on copyright rules. Quilting must be through all 3 layers (top, batting and back) and not be mounted on a frame, the quilt may have a sleeve attached to the back for the purpose of hanging the quilt. Winning quilt in section 2 & 3 is eligible to compete at the District Level.
